From Pastor Sullivan's Desk

Don't you know that all who are in a race run but only one wins the prize? Like them, run to win! Anyone who enters a contest goes into strict training. Now, they do it to win a wreath that withers, but we do it to win one that never withers. So I run with a clear goal ahead of me. I fight and don't just shadow box. No, I beat my body and make it my slave so that, when I've called others to run the race, I myself will not somehow be disqualified.

(1 Corinthians 9:24-27 - AAT)

They did it again. The High School girls brought home another golden ball. A lot of hard work and training went into their achievement. The girls will tell you that they appreciate the support they received from their family, friends and community.

Can you imagine what it would have been like, if the girls didn't have the support they had? What if the bleachers were empty at every game and they only heard the fans of the other team cheering against them? What if no one in the community cared about their effort? What if their fellow classmates made fun of them for being on the basketball team? What if their parents only showed half-hearted support? Would the girls still have been able to win State? I guess it would have been possible, but it certainly would have been a lot harder. The cheering and the support of the crowd doesn't make champions, but it certainly helps athletes stay positive and focused.

Many of the girls on the basketball team are members of another team. They are contending in an important event that they would like to win: the relay race to heaven. God chose them for His team by creating faith in their hearts. The path is well defined, but the race is difficult. There are many obstacles. The opposing team is strong and has many fans cheering against God's team.

Do our girls, and the rest of our youth on God's team, have the support they need to win this race? When the children of Immanuel step out into the world, they are stepping into the opponent's stadium. It is filled with people cheering against them – wanting them to lose. Their own friends and classmates might make fun of them for being on God's team.

Are we supporting our youth in this race as much as we support them on the basketball court and football field? The trophy they are striving to win is not painted plastic, but the crown of eternal


life. They need our support every bit as much as the girls Basketball team needed it to win State. Truth be told – they need it more!

A Simple Bible



Wouldn’t it be nice if there were a simple Bible in everyday English? Wouldn’t it be nice if a Lutheran translated it? Actually, such a Bible exists! Dr. William Beck, a former professor in the Missouri Synod, wanted a simple, accurate and doctrinally correct translation that Sunday School teachers could use in the classroom. He translated the Bible into simple English. His translation was published in 1976. It is called: “An America Translation.”

Some of our very own Wisconsin Synod professors have been involved in revising it. Every WELS review of this Bible has stated that it’s a translation that we can use with a high degree of confidence. The only major “complaint” some have lodged against this Bible is that the language is too “coffee and donuts” like. In other words, the language is like what you would hear at a local coffee shop (minus all the cuss words). Sadly, not many people know about this good translation.

Did you know that the children of Dr. Beck are WELS members? Did you know that they offered this Bible to our Synod royalty free? Did you know that they are listening to anyone (especially WELS pastors and professors) who want to help them make this Bible even better? Did you know that this is one of the best translations for prophecies of Christ?

For all these reasons, I will be using this Bible for confirmation next year and recommending its usage in Sunday School. The publisher has agreed to sell this Bible to the congregation at a wholesale rate. If you are interested in purchasing this Bible for yourself – talk to pastor. The cost is \$12.87/Bible.

A Bible For Worship

As many of you know, the NIV has been changed. Old NIVs are disappearing from websites and bookstore shelves. The new NIV (still called NIV – to add to the confusion) has made some changes that prevent me from recommending it anymore.

I will continue to use the old NIV in worship for the time being, but I do think that we should look into a new translation for Bible Class and worship. I can't make this decision alone. I need your help.

I have started emailing out a daily devotion to the elders and council. The email contains a short Bible reading in 3 different translations. What I am asking the recipients to do is simply to read one translation in the morning, another one at noon and the last one in the evening. You don't have to evaluate doctrine. Just read the translations devotionally. That's it.

The translations are:

- The New King James Version (NKJV) – an excellent revision of the King James Version. It excels in showing Messianic prophecy. It is a very literal translation that gives you insight into the Greek and Hebrew way of saying things. It reads like the King James Version in modern English. Most congregations in our sister synod (the ELS) use this translation.
- The English Standard Version (ESV) – Another literal translation of the Bible. It uses simpler grammar than the NKJV, but sometimes more difficult words. The Missouri Synod has adopted this translation for use in all its publications.
- An American Translation (AAT) – This little known Bible is a “thought-for thought” translation, which excels in Messianic prophecy. It is written in simple, everyday English. It is a Lutheran translation, which I will be using for youth confirmation classes in the future.

After receiving the emails for about six months, you probably will have an opinion as to which translation you would like read from the pulpit and used in Bible Class. You probably will agree with me that all of these translations are excellent in their own right. All of them are worth owning and studying: the NKJV is an excellent Bible for in depth study and preaching; the AAT is a great to have for a simple understanding of the Bible; the ESV has a lot excellent Lutheran resources available – most notably the Lutheran Study Bible.

What's my personal opinion? I don't limit myself to one Bible. I like using them both the AAT for overview reading and the NKJV for in depth study. But that's just me. We need to decide is what's best for our congregation.

Would you like to be a part of the process of picking a translation for worship and Bible Class? If so, send me your email address, and I will put you on the list!

You can access this information on the WELS website as well. {The statement on abortion was revised in the 2011 convention, so for the correct statement on that subject you need to go to the website.} I think it is good to stay involved and knowledgeable of what our synod and Christian church are all about and doing. Otherwise, bad things may result because we as Christians fail to keep watch and fail to execute our Christian duty to question and test words and actions related to his Word and the Christian church, which is what the Lord directs us to do. Some day a different translation (or more than one) than the NIV84 will have to be adopted for common use. The Church Council and Pastor have started to look at this issue.

Property Board Report

Waiting for winter to end? Ready for spring clean up? The property board, in conjunction with the Men's Club, are bonding together, waiting for the right time to conduct a clean up around the church property once the snow decides to melt. Planning is in progress for three large projects to be completed this year at Immanuel. They are the front concrete of the church project, carpeting at the back of church and the woodwork of the stained glass windows. All have been budgeted in this year's program.

There have been numerous maintenance projects already completed since the first of this year. Those were: replacement of broken exit lights, purchase of a new vacuum cleaner, installation of drip caps above the gym doors, replacement of an obsolete fire extinguisher in the kitchen, elevator inspections and a contract renewal, repair of a heat register water leak, plastic trim replacement of the broken bubbler trim in the lobby of the Family Life Center, lots of cleaning and maintenance by volunteers, and that is all I can think of at this time.

Did you notice how the veneer trim is peeling away on the bottom doors of the church? The property board is looking into how to remedy this problem. Gretz Carpentry has been summoned to examine the doors and give a recommendation on the best fix for this problem. Kick plates to be attached to the door bottoms have been suggested. These plates would give the doors stability, prevents any more stripping of veneer, gives the door impact protection, and provides the door a neat appearance.

The Pizza making day was a huge success. 3200 Pizza's WOW! The process made a mess in the Fellowship Hall. But, you know. The cleaning process after, made the basement much cleaner than before we started. Thanks to those people that labored, purchased pizzas, and credit be given to the organizers of such event to make things run smooth.

Manitowoc Lutheran High School (MLHS) Delegate Report

I have been actively encouraging holding tuition cost steady. The school has done so for several years. However, the Federation voted to approve a tuition increase of \$100 per year. This raises the annual tuition to \$5,100.00. This is unfortunate but was considered necessary by the majority of the delegates to cover rising costs. Tuition had been steady at \$5000.00 for the last three school years.

Plans are made to expand the football field bleachers. This project is presently estimated to cost in the vicinity of \$69,000.00.

Fifty-seven 8th grade students have registered for next year. Enrollment is expected to be 234 students next year. The valedictorian for the class of 2013 is Kara Schultz. Salutatorian is Anna Gries.

Security of MLHS has been reviewed following the tragedy that happened in Connecticut. Some adjustments as suggested by the Manitowoc Police Dept have been made.

Staffing Update. A part-time one-year call was issued to Grant Barthel to teach one section of American History and one section of Human Relations. The Federation approved the calling of two part-time teachers to cover additional sections of Religion and Social Studies.

MLHS Endowment Account status:

Total Balance on Hand (as of end of Dec2012) = \$1,953,868.87.

Accumulated Interest (FYTD) = \$41,917.19

Of this \$16,724.24 was marked for Operation Budget, \$21,008.61 went for Tuition Assistance and \$4,184.34 went for Worker Training. *If you are interested in various ways of supporting Christian education consider a future endowment to MLHS.*

Phase III Capital Appeal status:

Gifts and Pledges (thru 1/31/13) = \$1,077,042.00. *Here is another great opportunity to support Christian education for the future.* Contributing to the Phase III capital appeal puts your money to work expanding and building our HS campus of the future. MLHS SCRIP Report: MLHS SCRIP sales are an important part in support of MLHS tuition assistance. *When you buy SCRIP please consider buying it from MLHS to support present and future generations of our high schools students and their families.* You can contact my wife Ann, myself, or the MLHS SCRIP office for information.
